Natchitoches Parish Emergency Outdoor Warning System

The System

The Natchitoches Parish Emergency Outdoor Warning system consists of 19 warning sirens placed strategically throughout the parish.

The system is designed and utilized as an effective means for early warning to alert citizens who are outdoors of imminent severe weather or other emergencies and threats. Air-conditioning, thunder, wind, rain, and other conditions can cause the sirens not to be heard indoors therefore it should not be relied upon for your as your sole notification method. Although the system has public address capabilities, it may not provide specific and comprehensive information concerning the threat or exact location of the potential danger. For this reason, if you hear a siren, you should seek shelter immediately as the threat may be in your immediate area.

Activation

The outdoor warning sirens for any or all of the siren sites in Natchitoches Parish are activated when the National Weather Service issues a weather "Warning" or when a local determination is made that a tornado or other severe man made or natural threat to the area exists.

This determination is made by local Public Safety officials and based on the evaluation of all available information. If the outdoor warning sirens are heard at any time, seek shelter or follow audible instructions AND tune in to local radio and television, or your NOAA weather radio for instructions and information. It is important to remember that any thunderstorm can produce a tornado with little or no warning. The outdoor warning siren system is an effective method of outdoor notification, but Natchitoches Parish Communications District recommends duplicate ways of receiving warnings and notifications.

In other words, it is best to have more than one way to be warned of

potential dangers. Register with Natchitoches Parish First Call to be alerted via your telephone and mobile devices. Warnings and emergency notifications can be monitored via the following:

- NOAA Weather Radios
- Internet
- Local Media Outlets
- Observing Sky Conditions

IMPORTANT: Do not call "9-1-1" for weather updates. This ties up critical emergency lines and could cause delays in processing emergency calls.
